FREEDOM STORY (AFTERCARE)

Testimony from a Volunteer in Eastern Ontario:

What a year it has been! When Covid-19 hit in March our team was able to provide gift cards to four of the women that we have been supporting for a number of years. This helped them to provide for their children in the midst of the uncertainty and instability of the pandemic. Then, in May and August we were able to provide more gift cards to women we are supporting. Each time that we were able to give out these cards, the women were so very moved and all stated that it had come at just the perfect time.



One woman shared, "I know that \$50 doesn't seem like a whole lot, but it made all the difference for me last month to be able to buy groceries and eat well."

I am so moved to see all that God is doing in the lives of the people we are journeying with! Two couples are even expecting little bundles of joy this year! We were so happy to be able to host a Covid-safe baby shower on a restaurant patio over the summer for one of the couples. We showered both mom and dad with love, gifts, and prayers. They were totally surprised!

I am so excited to see that one of the young women we are supporting has been doing so well! She is so engaged in her faith, has been excelling in university, and was even offered a position to work on a program in her studies! This has been so wonderful to see!

ANNUAL FIGHT4FREEDOM REPORT

Another young woman recently found a very nice home, received a certification to begin working in aesthetics, and I had the honour of being a test client for her. It was so fun to do this with her and support her dreams in this way!

I am happy to share that even in the midst of this pandemic, the folks we are supporting have been reaching out more regularly for prayer, for encouragement, and even just to touch base and chat.

One of the most exciting things I have seen this year is survivors reaching out to support fellow survivors. This fall, we asked our community for extra support for a young woman who needed a helping hand and I was amazed to see a number of survivors reach out and offer gift cards and help to this



young woman! It is so wonderful to see God working through women that we have loved and supported as they reach out to love and support those around them!

I could go on and on, and I know that we serve a great God. What an honour it is to see Him working!

OUTREACH STORY

Every outreach looks different. This is true for all types of outreach with Fight4Freedom. There are times where team members can have long and deep conversations and there are times when they are brief. We often do not think much about these brief interactions or consider the impact that they may have. However, time and time again, our teams are reminded of the significance of these brief interactions with individuals to whom we outreach.

Due to guidelines given by the government during this pandemic, Fight4Freedom paused in-person outreach for almost four months. When we resumed outreach, one of our teams was able to connect to an individual who had recently received a difficult diagnosis. She was so thankful to be able to share her fear and loneliness with our team. Her family had dismissed her after hearing her diagnosis, making it clear that they would not be able to help with the cost of medication. She felt isolated and worried that she would not be able to afford the costs associated with her diagnosis.

During the conversation, the team asked her why she had opened up and shared her struggles with them. She answered, "I remember you. I met you guys once while working at another location a couple of years ago. You visited us." One team member on this team is a member of this other team. The interaction that this team member had with her was likely a brief one. However, even this brief interaction left an impression on her heart and opened the door of trust for her to take the step of sharing her struggles with the outreach team.

Thanks to one small interaction from years ago, this woman regained the belief that she does not have to face this challenge alone and there are people who care about her and are on her side.

The education team is excited about *future* projects, including:

- Developing an online course on sex trafficking for staff, volunteers, and community members
- Freedom Friday Webinar Series launching in 2021
- Developing and sharing church resources
- Ongoing research projects focused on housing, PCEPA legislation, the financial sector, policy development & more!

The education team has currently developed training materials on the following topics:

- Human Trafficking 101: 1 hour
- Training for Service Providers (HT 101 & Safe Spaces): 1.5 hours
- Porn and Sex Trafficking: 1 hour
- Training for Foster Parents: 1.5-2 hours
- Human Trafficking & Online Safety: 1 hour
- Two-part training for youth:
 - Part 1: Human Trafficking & Online Safety: 1.5 hours
 - Part 2: Healthy Relationships, Boundaries, Consent: 1.5 hours
- HT 101 & Parenting in the Digital Age: 1.5 hours



Through speaking engagements, sometimes individuals disclose that they are being groomed or have experienced exploitation.

Through the information presented, individuals are able to name and identify their experience. Once a disclosure is made, our team connects them with support.

THE RIPPLE EFFECT OF EDUCATION

Awareness of trafficking often mobilizes people to get involved in their community. After a presentation to a church youth group, a young girl now desires to be an inner-city missionary when she grows up. After a presentation to a group of men at a self-defense conference, some joined our team as volunteers, and others are offering pro-bono services to individuals we support. After a church presentation, we saw many volunteers join outreach teams, financial donations made, and people offering services to support survivors in our community.

The Safe@Home campaign was a great opportunity to share with parents the importance of keeping their kids and youth safe online! The campaign went indepth to explain the important role of a caregiver in talking to and ensuring kids are safe online. It empowered parents to know what online platforms are most used by kids, and how perpetrators use these for exploitative purposes. There were also tips and how-to guides for starting or continuing conversations around online safety and human trafficking with kids and youth.

CREATIVE

Our creative team underwent some major transitions this year. The first of which was that we welcomed a **new creative coordinator** onto our staff team! Under the vision of our new coordinator, we rolled out new awareness campaigns in collaboration with education and were able to successfully promote several of our events. OUTREACH

OUTREACH



Our outreach and ministry areas have continued to **grow steadily** in 2019. We currently have outreach taking place in two provinces in Canada, the Philippines, and we will soon be launching outreach in the United States. We are developing new areas of outreach to adapt to our ever-changing world and continue to be effective advocates as sex trafficking

moves more underground in our electronic age. The **purpose** of our outreach initiatives is to be present in spaces where sex trafficking and exploitation are known to occur, to build real and trusting relationships with the individuals there, to provide a safe connection outside of these situations for these individuals, and to provide support to those who are in need of help. The longer we do outreach, the more we are seeing real relationships come to fruition as well as our volunteers and staff growing in their ability to support individuals seeking assistance.

PRISON MINISTRY

In September 2019, Fight4Freedom's Prison Ministry set up a partnership with the Vanier Center for Women's chaplaincy program and began our monthly visitation to provide service counseling and support for women who are looking for integration assistance upon their release and are impacted by sex trafficking and the sex industry.



UPDATING PROCESSES



In the Summer of 2020, we reviewed and updated our incoming volunteer process, with the help of **FaithTech Fellowship Group**, so that some of our training is conducted through

Google Classroom. This helped to create *more effective and standardized* training materials and processes.

REACHING OUT TO MEN

It has always been part of **Fight4Freedom**'s vision to have a branch that focuses on reaching out to men who are impacted by sex trafficking and the sex industry. In September 2019, a couple of our staff members went on a vision trip to Thailand and connected with a ministry that focuses on ministering to purchasers of sex.

Since then, there has been a **growth** in the number of male volunteers. We hope to form a men ministry focus group within



Fight4Freedom in the next fiscal year and explore ways to outreach to men who are impacted by sex trafficking and the sex industry.

ONLINE



During Covid-19, the sex industry continued to move increasingly online. There was a **40% increase** in incidents of child online exploitation reported by Cybertip.ca in April 2020. During the months that in-person outreach was closed, online ministry was the *only* platform to reach out to people impacted by the sex industry. Some women that we outreached had expressed their

appreciation that someone cared for them during the pandemic. Some shared with us their financial struggle and we were able to provide them with *support* or *referrals*. Through this platform, a team encountered a minor and reported to the police.

AFTERCARE



This past year has been so exciting for the survivor care department as we have invested in our programming, grown our staff and volunteer team, strengthened our existing programs, and developed new program ideas!

Working with survivors is a long road: it can be challenging, tiring, discouraging, and confusing. But, with time we see the fruits of **unconditional** care and support. For some, after a year of hard work, they find themselves in new and amazing places, for others after many years they find

themselves settling in, growing their families, and achieving dreams they never thought possible. The survivors we work with are beautiful, strong, resilient, tenacious, hardworking, inspiring people and it is such a joy to be on this journey with them through the challenges and the triumphs!



Survivors...

- found new employment, transitional housing that will help them work toward long-term safety and stability
- have been working hard to support and care for their families and children, and have started new school programs as they work toward their dreams
- are growing their families and having children
- moved into long-term, stable housing
- are in much more stable spaces now
- women are striving towards independence and attaining sobriety, recovery, stable housing, full-time custody of their children, employment, and many other little beautiful necessities in life

And...

- even in the midst of Covid, our team has been able to continuously connect with and support survivors and everyone adapted so well to the sudden move to virtual connections in the Spring.
- we are now able to offer in-house therapy at no cost to survivors, as well as pastoral care and spiritual direction to survivors
- churches have partnered with us to offer gifts to the survivors we support on special occasions
- generous donors have participated in gift-card drives to help those with urgent needs

AFTERCARE - STATS



In this coming year, the survivor care team is working to develop **new** and **relevant** programs and services to better support survivors across the province. These include:

- **SUPPORT GROUPS:** to allow survivors to come together and share their stories and experiences in a supportive, safe, understanding environment
- **WORKSHOPS:** to support individuals with employment planning, housing, finding support services, develop self-care, build financial literacy, and more
- HOUSING BURSARIES: to help survivors attain safe and sustainable housing
- SURVIVOR RETREAT: to allow survivors to get away, rest, learn, and grow together.

EVENTS



In September 2019, **Walk4Freedom** took place in **20 cities** and **3 countries**. The event raised 20K to support our efforts to fight trafficking. This is an annual event where participants walk and pray in areas where sex trafficking and sexual exploitation are known to occur.

Freedom Night took place in Ottawa in November 2019. It was an evening filled with testimonies from survivors, donors, and volunteers of how God is at work in the City of Ottawa. The event also included *live music, poetry, a presentation about the vision and mission of F4F, and more*. During one of the testimonies, a survivor talked about how there is a gap in life that exists between leaving the sex industry and finding a new approach to life. How a survivor fills this gap makes all the difference. The individual shared how faith and a loving community is integral to a survivor's healing journey.



FabFeb is a month-long campaign to raise awareness and funds for the efforts to end sex trafficking. Participants become Freedom Advocates by wearing red ribbons, bold lipstick, or bowties. All proceeds go towards Fight4Freedom's ministries and initiatives. In 2020, we raised over our \$10k goal and saw businesses, radio stations, and community members come together to make the event a success!

On Friday, April 24, we held an online event on human trafficking and pornography. **Rev. Daniel Gilman**, from Ravi Zacharias International Ministries and who previously served as the Director for Human Rights Projects at Canada's Parliament was our keynote speaker. Daniel talked about the *link between porn and sex trafficking*, how people are of infinite worth to God, and how we can use our voices and be persistent in speaking against human trafficking.

Fight4Freedom held its first-ever **Talent4Freedom**. The event raised **\$2,000** to support our work in the Philippines. This event brought together artists and talented individuals locally and globally. **The event had over 1,000 views via Facebook Live** and helped to raise awareness on how trafficking happens in the Philippines.



ADMIN

Our administrative team is made up of support from admin and human resources. In HR, we welcomed a *strong volunteer* who coordinates our outreach processing. In addition to this, we have welcomed a *new staff member* who has taken over a role as our Volunteer Coordinator which is such an answer to prayer! Our Volunteer Coordinator has done a fantastic job to keep our records up to date and helping us honour the volunteers that make our work possible. Her assistance as a volunteer coordinator makes our support, care, and management of volunteers more robust. Our new processes have allowed us to **track our volunteer metrics** and has made it easier for our regional reps to get volunteers on their outreach teams quickly and efficiently! The HR and admin departments oversaw our transition to doing volunteer training over Google Classroom, rather than requiring in-person training.



Meanwhile, our admin team has been busy *adopting some new volunteers*! Admin is now overseeing several volunteers with the goal to bring more on in the near future. This past year, admin did an overhaul edit on the content of the **Fight4Freedom** website. We designed new pages, created educational resources, and edited terminology to be the most up-to-date and accurate. When Covid-19 shut everything down earlier in the year, the administrative and HR teams were instrumental in transitioning everything over to our online capacity. In addition to this, our admin and HR teams are what allow for the smooth day-to-day functioning of **Fight4Freedom** as a whole.

WELLNESS

This past year, Fight4Freedom launched a Wellness team. The Wellness department is made up of a registered psychotherapist, a certified Spiritual Director, and a Pastoral director. Wellness support services are offered to survivors that we are journeying with as well as the staff and volunteer team. This past year, one of Fight4Freedom's goals was to establish the Counselling Department. We have been working on policies, procedures as well as starting to counsel staff, volunteers, and survivors.

WELLNESS TEAM HIGHLIGHTS:

- In January 2020, the counselor on staff started working with a survivor and observed the growth and changes that happened in their life. Shortly afterward, she began to support more survivors as clients.
- This year we have journeyed with survivors as they overcame abusive relationships, nightmares, and mental health struggles.
- We facilitated workshops for the staff on topics of self-care, anxiety, depression, etc.
- The Counselling department grew to a team of two!.
- Fight4Freedom has been able to provide counseling to 15 clients this past year.
- We established a counseling internship for a Tyndale student.
- We have navigated the reality of meeting clients virtually throughout the pandemic..
- We are developing workshops for the survivors we support.
- We developed to help staff navigate the Covid season.
- Provided spiritual direction for 9 staff and 1 survivor. Most staff meet regularly to practice discernment and intimacy with God.
- Developed a 5-day Retreat Daily Life guideline for staff to use for their spiritual health days and personal sabbaths.
- We host a weekly Friday prayer time with staff pray over our work..

WHAT'S AHEAD?

- Developing a prayer guide for staff and outreach teams.
- Launching a discernment prayer team.
- Developing a workshop on spiritual warfare.
- Launching a prayer request page on Fight4Freedom website.

FINANCES





CANADA

We are tremendously excited that after a vision trip to the Maritimes last year, an outreach team is forming and we have hopes and plans of expanding **Fight4Freedom** into the East Coast in the coming months.



UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

One of our staff members is moving to

Chicago in the next 12 months to help start our official first American team, with hopes to expand throughout the nation in areas impacted by the sex industry and trafficking.



INTERNATIONAL

Every two weeks, an international leadership team meets to discuss vision, dreams, and hopes of expanding into other nations of interest as the opportunity presents itself. In September 2019, a Fight4Freedom staff member and a volunteer went on a vision trip to Thailand to explore opportunities to partner in ministry and learn from work being done to combat trafficking.





OUTREACH

Before March 2019, the Philippines team continued with outreach efforts and have added more potential outreach locations. Through outreach, we have reached out to almost **100 women** in the karaoke bars per month. We had four active volunteers last year, reaching out to two outreach locations. We also want to mobilize more volunteers to create more outreach teams. There are about 3 potential outreach locations that we need at least 10 new volunteers for.

COMMUNICATIONS

Fight4Freedom Philippines is working towards registering as an official NGO in the Philippines. The **Fight4Freedom Philippines** page launched an Instagram and Facebook account this year, with **over 150 followers** in total. They are hiring a new local Filipino staff member to help organize partnerships and manage social media accounts.

PARTNERSHIPS

This year, we have made headway in partnership with local Filipino churches, NGOs, businesses, and a university. We have also been connected to multimedia companies and had even participated in one cable show where we talked about human trafficking and the work we do. A couple of small businesses, a coffee shop, and a fitness centre, have also touched base with us with interest in coming up with ways to partner together. We have also been connected with a university with hopes of hosting a few sessions for their first-year students to raise awareness about human trafficking.

The biggest partnership highlight was with an NGO coalition whose goal was to create a unified referral system within local faith-based NGOs. **Fight4Freedom Philippines** joined in the numerous workshops to help develop a collaborative system. This is the first in the country and will help with opening up better communication between NGOs to improve survivor care, ensuring that survivors get the help they need more quickly and efficiently.

PRAISE AND PRAYER

PRAISE

- Many of our outreach teams are making better connections with the individuals
 they have been reaching out to for years. This deepening of relationships is an
 answer to our prayers.
- Prayers that finances would not suffer in Covid were answered as we were able to **make our income projected goal** for the past fiscal year.
- In October 2019, the education department asked for prayer for a staff member to join the team. In November that **prayer was answered** and the team grew to 2 people. In December, the department asked for prayer that a staff member would join the team in the area of research. In February, that prayer was also answered. There has been a *substantial increase* in both staff and volunteers.

Department now has 5 staff, 1 intern, 19 volunteers

- Furniture donations are going to women to furnish their first places after exiting the industry.
- Funding! An exciting **increase** in bursaries and funding towards our budget which helps women to access basic necessities and care.
- We have seen **God** working in wonderful ways this last year, providing for and protecting our team, providing for and protecting survivors, and making things possible that we could never accomplish on our own. Every triumph and challenge overcome is an answer to prayer, whether it is a survivor moving into a transitional home, someone regaining custody of their children, the birth of a healthy baby, or gift cards provided to meet basic needs. Here are a few of our answered prayers from this past year:
 - We had a psychotherapist join our staff team who is now able to offer therapy free of charge to survivors.
 - One individual who moved and lost contact with our team recently reached out again and we are able to begin meeting with her once more.
 - Folks transitioned so well to receiving support virtually in light of the pandemic.
 - Our community stepped up and provided us with extra gift-card donations when needs sky-rocketed as a result of Covid-19.


WE ASK FOR PRAYER...

- for a survivor to be able to finish school and we're currently helping with job searching.
- for more volunteers to join our outreach teams.
- for Chicago plans to be safe and smooth for immigration and charitable status.
- for all staff members who are raising their salary support.
- for the counseling department to continue to grow in personnel and in programs that can help serve our clients.
- for wisdom as the team navigates growth and mobilization during the pandemic.
- that God would point us in the direction he wants us to go. We have so many potential projects we want to work on: pray that God would guide us to the ones we are meant to focus on.
- for the Philippines charity registration process, staff hiring and volunteer mobilization.
 - **registration:** due to Covid-19, all operations in the Philippines have been put on hold. It is hard to restart the registration process due to government offices being closed. We need prayer for favor as we restart this process.
 - **staff hiring:** we are planning to hire two local Filipino staff. We need prayer for discernment and for us to find the right fit for our developing team in the Philippines.
 - **volunteer mobilization:** we need prayer for churches to be more open to mobilizing their congregation to join outreaches. Prayer is also needed as we work to look for more volunteers.
